The All India Chess Federation for the Blind (AICFB) was established in 1997 with the objective of promoting the game of chess among the visually impaired all over the country. The AICFB is affiliated to the International Braille Chess Association (IBCA) and All India Chess Federation (Recognized by Government of India), and through this affiliation has been able to integrate India with the rest of the chess

Vision & Mission

The AICFB was established with the objective of promoting the game of chess among the visually impaired. All over the country, we wish to bring blind chess players in India on par with the best in the world. Ever since the formation of the AICFB & its Affiliation to the IBCA, & AICF (recognized by Govt. of India) blind chess players in our country have made tremendous progress.

Chess in Asian Para Games

The Chess game is introduced first time in Asian para games for visually Impaired. The visually impaired players represented India with the support of Paralympic Committee of India (PCI), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and Government of India.

Annual events conducted by AICFB:

- National A chess championship for the blind (winner is crown as 'National Blind Chess Champion'
- National Woman chess championship for the Blind (winner is crown as 'National Blind Woman chess champion)
- National Junior chess championship for the blind (Winner is crown as 'National Juniorblin chess champion')
- National School championship for the blind
- National Team Championship (One team from each state)
- FIDE rating National open tournament for the blind (4 tournament in a year)
- State chess championship for the blind (each state)
- AICFB also send top players to participate in major national and international mainstream chess tournaments aiming at inclusion in real sense.

Online Chess Training Portal

AICFB will be launching online chess training portal for visually challenged who have desire to enhance their current skills or improve their chances for professional advancement. Online training would enable to start a new course in just few mouse clicks at one's convenience.

Ongoing activities and programs

AICFB conduct following annual events. AICFB is conducting 3 level qualification cycle tournaments to select Blind chess team to represent India. Since 1999 we are conducting chess Olympiad and other world chess championships for men, women, junior and continental based

AICFB is very proud to state that India is second country to have dedicated FIDE rating for conducting tournaments for blind after Russia.


Talk 64 chess software with speech


Participations and Achievements

In 2006 India launched Talk 64 chess software with speech, first and only chess software for the blind, used by 30+ countries. All new initiatives like Internet radio, online training and library portal also have huge potential to become global soon. Probably, contribution of AICFB in creating innovative technology are amongst few where western countries are in receiving mode. - 2006-11th World chess championship for the blind, Goa

- 2017- 2nd Asian Chess championship for the blind, Manipal

International Participation

In last 25 years India participated in 6 Olympiads, 6 world chess championships, 10 world junior, 4 woman world championship 4 world cup team event and 3 international open tournament.

- In Asian para games 2022, Our players won 8 medals which includes 2 gold, 1 silver and 5 bronze medals.
- For the first time in the history of IBCA, India bagged two
 medals in the 16th IBCA Chess Olympiad for the Blind
 and Visually Impaired 2021 was held in Rhodes, Greece
 from 16th October to 27th October, 2021. On the top
 board, Aryan Joshi clinched the bronze for his rating
 performance of 2258.
- Darpan Inani secured bronze for his solid performance on board 3. He scored 6.5/9 with a rating performance of 2131.

- 2022- Soundarya Kumar Pradhan clinched the gold medal on board 2 and Kishan Gangolli & Swapnil Shah secured silver medal on board 3 and 5 respectively in 09th IBCA World Team Chess Championship for the Blind and Visually Impaired.
- 2022- Aryan Joshi won Silver medal in 11th IBCA Junior Individual Championship for the Blind and Visually Impaired.
- 2023- Kishan Gangolli got silver medal on board 3 in FIDE Chess Olympiad for person with disability and also best game of the tournament prize.
- Dr. Charudatta Jadhav has nominated as a 'President' of International Braille Chess Association', IBCA world apex body for chess for the blind in world, first and only non European to get this recognition.

Domestic Tournaments conducted

Tournaments conducted Since 1998

- 34 National championships (Men, Women, junior (under 19), School)
- 75+ FIDE rating national open chess tournament
- 350+ domestic tournaments (Zonals, States, National open, Invitation cup) for world championship.
- AICFB produce 500+ FIDE rated blind chess players till now, very few countries have achieved this land mark.
- Since 1999, every year, AICFB has conducted selection cycle State, Zonal and National Selection to declare 'National Champion' and select Indian team for world championship.

How do the visually impaired play Chess

The Chess Board of 64 squares has the following modifications:

- All the Black squares are raised about 3-4 mm above the white squares
- Each of the squares on the Board has a hole in the centre. Each of the pieces has a
 downward projection (nail) at the base, which fits into the hole in the squares on the
 Board, fixing the piece securely on the board.
- All the Black pieces have a pin fixed on their heads helping the player distinguish between a white and a black piece.
- After making every move, the visually impaired person announces the move aloud, so that his opponent comes to know of the move. Instead of writing the moves on a Score Sheet, the player writes the moves in Braille or records the moves on a tape recorder.
